6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Academic Calendar is provided to the staff in the beginning of the academic year in which the rules and regulations, academic activities and examination schedule are given.
- The computer aided learning is given priority. Staff use Audio-Visual Aids and ICT in the classroom
- The college has well experienced and qualified lecturers to teach all the courses
- The staff and students are encouraged to attend refresher courses, seminars, workshops, conferences and Orientation courses
- Feed back is collected from students about the lecturer's performance.
- API score is measured for every lecturer at end of academic year. It is the indicator for Academic performance of the faculty.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Internal examinations are conducted. Along with written examinations, seminars and assignments are given to the students for the evaluation of their academic status

Marks gained in slip tests/assignments ,Unit tests (one test for every two months),Quarterly and Half yearly are accumulated and allotted as INTERNALS for 20 marks and added to the score of external examinations

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college encourages staff and students to engage in research activates. As a result this year 8 lecturers enrolled for Ph.D (part time). J. Nageswara rao (Physics), Mrs. Sri lakshmi ,(English) enrolled in Krishna Univeristy, machilipatnam , Manimala(Bot) enrolled in Andhra University. Veera kumari(Eco) and ,Madan(Botany) enrolled in Nagarjuna University for part time Ph.D work . And another Lecturer G.J. Mounika is now ready to submit her Ph.D thesis work in couple of months.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library is provided with 7616 books. Library is major tool of learning for students. As most of the students are poor they depend on library for books. library is provided with computer and internet facility. With philanthropic contribution we received books which worth Rs. 1,72,000 this year. We planning to improve the library with UGC funds and RUSA.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Staff is recruited by Government through transfer or Direct recruitment. Eight lecturers are pursuing part time PhD. All the lecturers are encouraged to participate in national seminars

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Permanent Lecturers are recruited by Public Service Commission who is highly qualified with SET/NET/M.Phil/Ph.D qualifications

The guest and contact lecturers who performed well are given teaching assignments in the next academic year automatically. Those contract lecturers whose students pass percentage is less than 40 are not continued as per the government policy

BEST PRACTICES

1. MID DAY MEAL SCHEME FOR ALL THE STUDENTS.

Mid day Meal Scheme is the brain child of Dr. Velaga Joshi, Principal of this college.

In this scheme Lunch is prepared for all the students every day free of cost.

This is the first time in the state that such a scheme introduced for the first time in Graduate level . This is the first Degree College in the state that provides **food to ALL the students** in the colleg**e every day**. This is done by the contribution of money and food items by the staff and Philanthrophists. Every Lecturer Contributed to this every month from their salary(Minimum rs 500/-). We started this programme with our own expenditure, later some local people joined us including CPDC members and Alumni . This increased retention of students in the afternoon session. Also result increased this year with this efforts.

2. VEHICLE FREE DAY IN ONCE IN A MONTH

To inculcate the spirit of environmental protection among the students we started this scheme. In this programme once in a month i.e. last Friday of every month No Motor vehicles are allowed in to the campus. All the students and Lecturers come to college by walk, or by public transport or by using bicycle. On this day lecturers do not use their personal vehicle. This is to made campus eco friendly. This will reduce the emission of green house gases and also saves Forex reserves of our country through reduced use of carbon fuels

3.NIGHT SCHOOLS BY STUDENTS

Students are conducting night schools to literate neighbouring villages people(Nagireddy Gudem and Recharla villages).
