5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

Government of Andhra Pradesh Sanction an amount 1.75 Lakh under SC and ST book bank and Institution purchased Books like PG Entrance exams, Group-I &II, exams, Police recruitment books, Arithmetic, Civil services books...etc. Students utilised these books and received guidance from their subject lecturers. As a result more than 90% of final year students got admissions in to PG Courses and many in to B.Ed courses.

The institution monitors and ensures the achievements of the learning outcome through analysis of the tests, examination results and the pass percentage approved in Awards Committee Meeting.

1. MID DAY MEAL SCHEME FOR ALL THE STUDENTS.

Mid day Meal Scheme is the brain child of Dr.Velaga Joshi, Former Principal of this college.

In this scheme Lunch is prepared for all the students every day free of cost.

This is the first time in the state that such a scheme introduced for the first time in Graduate level. This is the first Degree College in the state that provides **food to ALL the students** in the college **every day** .This is done by the contribution of money and food items by the staff and Philanthropists. Every Lecturer Contributed to this every month from their salary(Minimum Rs. 500/-).We started this programme with our own expenditure, later some local people joined us including CPDC members and Alumni . This increased retention of students in the afternoon session. Also result increased this year with this efforts.

2. VEHICLE FREE DAY IN ONCE IN A MONTH

To inculcate the spirit of environmental protection among the students we started this scheme.In this programme once in a month i.e. last Friday of every month No Motor vehicles are allowed in to the campus.All the students and Lecturers come to college by walk or by public transport or by using bicycle. On this day lecturers do not use their personal vehicle. This is to made campus eco friendly. This

will reduce the emission of green house gases and also saves Forest reserves of our country through reduced use of carbon fuels
